1977 **National Reading Sunday** (Lukusunnuntai) is organised for the first

1979 One of the world's first books for early reading, Pallero, is added to the Finnish maternity pack

1982 250 000 families have been given information about the importance of early reading, as a part of the maternity pack

1986 Finnish authors read poems aloud on the phone, for callers of the Poetry Phone (Runoluuri)

1990 The Author Center changes it's name: **The Finnish Reading Center** (Lukukeskus) moves to Villa Kivi

1997 National Reading Sunday expands to National Reading Week

1999 Lukufiilis Magazine for teenage readers starts being published regularly

2000 Kiiltomato.net, an online magazine by professional critics, is founded

2001: A Book Odyssey (Suuri 2001 kirjaseikkailu 2001) is a year-long project to encourage and inspire voung readers
